

STEPS ON HOW TO SET UP A FISH TANK:

- 1. Rinse out the gravel with cold water, NO SOAP! Lay gravel at the bottom of the tank.
- 2. Fill up tank with tap water, leaving about 1/4" at the top.
- 3. Power filter hangs on the back of the tank. Rinse out the filter pad with tap water. Fill the filter half

ways with water and then plug in. It should start up automatically.

4. Water conditioner:

Aqua Plus-1 capful for 10 gal.)

(Dechlor- 2 drops per gal.)

5. The Heater is placed on the back wall of the tank, while the thermometer is on the opposite front

wall of the tank.

6. Heater: Set in water and wait 15 minutes before plugging in. After it is plugged in, an orange light

should be on to let you know that the heater IS getting hotter. Push the knob down and turn it

towards the "H" for High. Come back and check the thermometer in a couple of hours and as soon

as the temperature reaches 80 degrees then you want to slowly turn the knob towards "L" for Low

until the light turns off. (Ideal temp, for tropical fish 78-82 degrees)

7. The light bulbs are screwed in to the light fixture and only turned on when you want to view the fish.

8. Let your new fish tank run for AT LEAST 24 HOURS before putting any fish! By the next day, the

water should be clear and you are ready to purchase your fish at PET SUPREME! Enjoy!

9. Don't forget to float the bag of fish in your new tank for 15 minutes before you let them go. No food

on the first day! The fish will not eat because they are still adjusting to their new home.

10. Starting on the second day you want to feed your fish a tiny pinch once a day. If the food is all gone

within a couple of minutes you can put in another pinch. Do not overfeed because it will cause

cloudy water.
