Habitat

☐ Hydrometer

□ Cage cleaner

Housing needs to be well ventilated. The appropriately size habitat should be a 10 gal. or larger.

☐ Under-tank heater mat

Place an under tank heater on one side of the habitat. Turn under-tank heater off for 12 hours a night as long as room temperature does not drop below 65 degrees.

Place a daytime heat bulb over the habitat to provide warmth. Turn off after 8-12 hours. A nighttime bulb can be added to view your pet at night.

Humidity level needs to be kept between 10-30% (with a moist retreat). A hydrometer will help you keep the desired level. Keeping the water dish full and misting every other day, will help with the humidity level.

Temperature for leopard geckos:

Day– Cool side: 75-85 °FDay– Warm Side: 85-95 °F

• Night: 65-75 °F

 Place a thermometer at each end of the habitat to monitor.

Use 2-3" of reptile calcium sand for a substrate. Spot clean once a week.

Nutrition

Crickets & mealworms can be fed to your leopard gecko. Make sure to dust and feed the insects special supplements so your leopard gecko can receive extra nutrients.

Leopard geckos should be fed at nighttime daily to every other day. Offer only enough they can consumed by the morning.

Leopard Geckos will drink water from a shallow dish and also lick moisture from their skin and habitat. Empty and refill water dish daily.

Health

Signs of a healthy leopard gecko:

- Clear, alert eyes
- Sheds regularly during growth
- Body and tail are rounded, filled out
- Eats and drinks normally
- Clear nose and vent
- Well-formed droppings every 2 days

Warning signs to watch for:

- Runny droppings or red streaks in droppings for more than two days.
- Eating or drinking less or weight loss
- Swelling
- Paralysis of limbs or tail
- Mucus in mouth or nose
- Shedding problems or discolored skin

If you notice any of these warning signs, speak with a sales associate or veterinarian.
